Dear Mr. Urban,

I left last night's meeting of FOLC very frustrated. Other than the gentleman's report on the comprehensive plan (GREAT JOB!) I didn't hear anything about how we might solve our county's problems. Is this county government actually IGNORING the suggestions in the comprehensive plan??

I didn't hear Mr. Beauchamp nor Mr. Jenkins give us any encouragement about the prospects for Lancaster County. Either of them could have said, "We're going to face a water crisis, but here are the steps we can take to prepare." Many of the county residents are still using wells, how will we pipe reservoir or desalinated water to the entire county? How do we get the water to the people?

What about county wide sewage treatment? Does that encourage growth? Does it help the Bay or cause more pollutants because of the growth?

Another statement that I would have liked to have heard was, "We're going to face a housing density problem, but this is what we think should happen -- our lawyer is looking at the regulations to advise us on good zoning for sensible growth..."

Our county roads, dumps, and other infrastructure will need to accommodate an influx of additional residents, but I heard nothing about how to manage or grow that infrastructure. District 1 & 2 are already bereft of many basic services.

What about the affordable housing for the workers who take care of the needs and services for the retired people? I heard alot of rhetoric, but no solutions or even ideas other than in other parts of the country the workers are being bused in. Is that a viable solution for Lancaster County? What other things we should be considering for the future of the county. Are our supervisors looking to the future or putting out fires?

I know I have many questions. But, I have faith that FOLC is addressing these questions. Now, let's hold our county representative's feet to the fire. Next time let's ask them to address the hard questions, not just give us a history and overview of the past. That was interesting, but it seemed to set the tone for the meeting and I didn't feel that we utilized our guests knowledge very well.

Also, Mr. Jenkins was very rude while Mr. Julian was speaking. Please consider having our chairman sit behind the table so that he can better

manage the meeting without being pulled into conversation with a guest or audience member. Just a suggestion.

Thanks everyone who is doing the hard work at FOLC.
