Annual Meeting – January 9, 2008

The annual meeting began at 7 p.m. Actions and discussions included the following:

- o Review of the organizational mission statement, and a determination that a quorum was present.
- o Request for speaker ideas. Suggestions included Planning Commissioner Don Gill and Margaret Sosi.
- o Review of recent newspaper articles on growth issues in Loudon County and Norfolk.
- o Treasurer's report. FOLC has \$3484.79 in the bank. The organization gave the Library \$400 last year. We can afford to advertise.
- o Election of officers. Following some discussion, the current officers were re-elected. Those officers are as follows: President - Charles Costello; Vice President - Bill Warren; Treasurer - Marilyn Hedges; Secretary - Jackie Ferriter, who will serve through March 2008. Be thinking of a new candidate.
- o President Costello noted that the organization would require a new president following his second term.

The annual meeting was adjourned and the regular meeting called to order. Items discussed included:

- o Pete Geilich will continue as Chairman of the Board of Supervisors this year. Jack Russell will be Vice-Chairman.
- o Butch Jenkins will become the Board liaison to the Planning Commission, replacing Ernest Palin, who becomes the Board liaison to the Social Services Board.
- o Upcoming issues before the Board of Supervisors will include the redevelopment at Greentown/Gaskins Road; the failure of the New Tides Group to follow through on its waste treatment plant proffer; water access issues.
- o The town of Kilmarnock is working on a waste treatment master plan.
- o Workforce housing: the Jessie Ball Dupont fund has provided funding through St. Mary's White Chapel to set up an ad hoc committee to study the issue and write a Request for Proposal to define the area's need.
- o The public access area planned for Ashley Cove continues to generate controversy. FOLC will follow the plans for environmental impact.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.
